Definition of Grades

The results of the International GCSE examinations are reported on an 8-point scale of grades: A*(a*), A(a), B(b), C(c), D(d), E(e), F(f) and G(g). Candidates who fail to reach the minimum standard for G(g) do not receive a grade. A subject not receiving a grade is not recorded on the certificate.

International GCSE Double Awards

The International GCSE Double Award is designed to cover the content of two full International GCSE subject courses. The results in these specifications are reported on a 15 point scale: A*A*(a*a*), A*A(a*a), AA(aa), AB(ab), BB(bb), BC(bc), CC(cc), CD(cd), DD(dd), DE(de), EE(ee), EF(ef), FF(ff), FG(fg), GG(gg) to indicate that the results in these specifications have the same status as GCSE grades in two other certificate subjects. Candidates who fail to reach the minimum standard for GG(gg) receive no grade and a subject receiving no grade is not recorded on the certificate.

English as a Second Language, French and German: optional speaking tests

The results of the optional speaking tests in English as a Second Language, French and German are recorded on the certificate separately from the results for International GCSE in English as a Second Language, French and German. The results of the speaking tests are reported on an 8-point scale of grades: A*(a*), A(a), B(b), C(c), D(d), E(e), F(f) and G(g). Candidates who fail to reach the minimum standard for G(g) do not receive a grade.

Computerised Accountancy

Computerised Accountancy is an optional, additional module. The result for this module is recorded on the certificate separately from the International GCSE Accounting result. Computerised Accounting is graded on a 3-point scale: Distinction, Merit, Pass. Candidates who fail to reach the minimum standard for Pass receive no grade and a subject or optional module receiving no grade is not recorded on the certificate.

An Advanced GCE award is broadly equivalent to a 6-unit Advanced VCE. Two Advanced GCE awards are broadly equivalent to a 12-unit Advanced Double Award VCE subject.

An Advanced Subsidiary GCE subject represents the first half of an Advanced GCE course of study and is broadly equivalent to a 3-unit Advanced Subsidiary VCE subject.

Advanced and Advanced Subsidiary VCE (Vocational Certificate of Education)

2001 - present

An Advanced Subsidiary VCE subject is a 3-unit award broadly equivalent to one Advanced Subsidiary GCE subject.

2001 - present

The results of Advanced VCE (Double Awards) are reported on a nine point scale of double grades: AA(aa), AB(ab), BB(bb), BC(bc), CC(cc), CD(cd), DD(dd), DE(de) and EE(ee) of which grade AA(aa) is the highest and grade EE(ee) the lowest. Candidates who fail to reach the minimum standard for a Grade EE(ee) are Unclassified.

An Advanced Double VCE subject is a 12-unit award broadly equivalent to two Advanced GCE subjects.

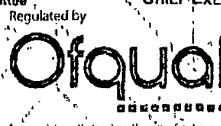

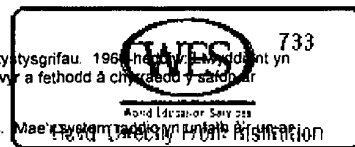

Ystyriwyd bod gradd 1 yn gyfateb i lwyddiant ar y safon Gyffredin (*h.y.i. radd C ar ôl 1975 - gweler TAG Safon Gyffredin uchod*). Cyhoeddwyd canlyniadau arholiadau mewn Llawfer a Theipio fel Llwyddiant/Methiant yn unig, ac nid oedd unrhyw gyfatebiaeth i unrhyw un o'r graddau TAU rhifol, nac i unrhyw arholiadau eraill.

Tystysgrif Gyffredinol Addysg Uwchradd (TGAU). 1988-heddiw: Cyflwynwyd TGAU i gymryd lle'r TAG Safon Gyffredin a TAU. Dynodir llwyddiant gan un o saith gradd A-G, gyda gradd A yr uchaf a gradd G yr isaf. O 1994, cyflwynwyd gradd ychwanegol (A*) i ddynodi'r lefel uchaf o gyflawniad. Ar gyfer Cymraeg a Saesneg, cyhoeddir gradd atodol hefyd i ddynodi cyflawniad Llafur.

TGAU Dwyrradd. Cofnodir canlyniadau ddwywaith i ddynodi bod ganddynt yr un statws â gradd TGAU mewn dau bwnc tystysgriffiad unigol arall.

Cwrs Byr TGAU. 1995-heddiw: Arholiadau a ddyluniwyd i gwmpasu dim llai na hanner y TGAU llawn cyfatebol, gyda'r un safonau graddio'n cael eu defnyddio.

Meysydd Llafur TGAU Cyfun. 1995-2002: Maes llafur yn tynnu ar ddau bwnc perthynol i ddarparu sail ar gyfer un dyfarniad.

Tystysgrif Cwricwlwm Cenedlaethol. 1995-1997: Yn y blynyddoedd hyn tystysgrifwyd y Cwrs Byr TGAU mewn TG fel y "Dystysgrif Cwricwlwm Cenedlaethol".

Tystysgrif mewn Mathemateg Ychwanegol. 1993-1999: Arholiad a dystysgrifir ar wahân o safon rhwng y TGAU a'r Safon Uwch. Aneilwyd yr arholiad at ymgeiswyr yn mlwyddyn gyntaf y cheched dosbarth oedd yn dilyn cwrs Safon Uwch mewn Mathemateg.

Lefel Mynediad/Tystysgrif Cyflawniad Addysgol. 1985-heddiw: Arholiad ar gyfer ymgeiswyr 16 oed yr ystyriwyd bod y TGAU yn amhriodol ar eu cyfer. Cyhoeddir canlyniadau fel Anrhydedd/Teilyngdod/Llwyddiant neu A/B/C gyda gradd A yr uchaf a gradd C yr isaf. Cynn 1997, cofnodwyd canlyniadau fel Llwyddiant (P) neu Dallyngdod (M).

Tystysgrif Addysg Estynedig (TAE). 1975-1985: Arholiad a anelwyd at ddisgyblion cheched dosbarth yr ystyriwyd bod y TAG Safon Uwch yn amhriodol ar eu cyfer. Gan na lwyddodd yr arholiad erioed i gael statws a gydnabuwyd yn swyddogol, ni chyhoeddwyd tystysgrifau TAE. Derbyniodd ymgeiswyr dystysgrifau TAU, ynghyd â "llythyr credyd" TAE. Yr oedd y llythyr credyd yn adrodd un o bum gradd TAE "answyddogol" I-V gyda gradd I yr uchaf a gradd V yr isaf.

Sgilliau Allweddol. 2001-heddiw: Cymwysterau nad ydynt yn benodol i oedran a fwriadir i'w defnyddio mewn ysgolion, colegau, hyfforddiant, addysg uwch a chyflogaeth. Fe'u tystysgrifir o lefel 1 i 4, gyda phob lefel yn cyfateb i'r rhai yn y Fframwaith Cymwysterau Cenedlaethol.

Tystysgrif mewn Sgilliau Swyddfa. 1984-2003: Amrediad o arholiadau mewn Llawfer, Teipio a Geirbrosesu ayb. Cofnodir y canlyniadau fel "Anrhydedd". "Credyd" neu "Llwyddiant" ac nid oes ganddynt unrhyw gyfatebiaeth uniongyrchol i unrhyw gymwysterau eraill a gynigir gan CBAC nac unrhyw gorff arall.

GCE Advanced Level. 1951-1962: Results issued as Pass/Fail only, no grades were recorded on certificates. 1963-present: Passes indicated by one of five grades A-E, of which grade A is the highest and grade E the lowest. From 1987-2001, grade N was awarded to candidates who failed to achieve the standard for grade E by a narrow margin.

GCE Advanced Supplementary. 1989-2001: Examinations which are of the same standard as Advanced Level, but cover approximately half the subject content. The grading system is identical to that for Advanced Level (above).

GCE Advanced Subsidiary. 2001-present: Examinations which represent the first half of a GCE Advanced Level course of study. The grading system is identical to that for Advanced Level (above).

GCE Ordinary Level. 1951-1974: Results issued Pass/Fail only, no grades were recorded on certificates. 1975-1987: Passes indicated by one of five grades A-E, of which grade A was the highest and grade E the lowest. Grades A-C were regarded as being the equivalent to passes under the previous grading arrangements. "AO" alongside a subject title indicates that the syllabus was designed for candidates of greater maturity.

Certificate of Secondary Education (CSE). 1965-1987: Results issued as one of five grades 1-5, of which grade 1 was the highest and grade 5 the lowest. Grade 1 was considered to be equivalent to a Pass at Ordinary Level (*i.e. to grade C after 1975-see GCE Ordinary Level above*). Results in Shorthand and Typewriting examinations were issued as Pass/Fail only, and the results had no equivalence to any of the numeric CSE grades, or to any other examinations.

General Certificate of Secondary Education (GCSE). 1988-present: GCSE was introduced to replace the former GCE Ordinary Level and CSE. Passes indicated by one of seven grades A-G, of which grade A is highest and grade G the lowest. From 1994, an additional grade (A*) was introduced to indicate the highest level of achievement. For English and Welsh, a supplementary grade is also issued to indicate Oral achievement.

GCSE Double Awards. Results are recorded twice to indicate that they have the same status as GCSE grades in two other single certificate subjects.

GCSE Short Course. 1995-present: Examinations designed to cover not less than half the corresponding full GCSE course, with the same grading standards applied.

GCSE Combined Subject Syllabuses. 1995-2002. A syllabus drawing on two related subjects to provide the basis for a single award.

National Curriculum Certificate. 1995-1997: In these years, the GCSE Short Course in IT was certificated as the "National Curriculum Certificate".

Certificate in Additional Mathematics. 1993-1999. A separately certificated examination of a standard between GCSE and Advanced Level. The examination was aimed at candidates in the first year of sixth form who were pursuing an Advanced Level course in Mathematics.

Entry Level/Certificate of Educational Achievement (CoEA). 1985-present: An examination for 16 year old candidates for whom GCSE is considered inappropriate. Results issued as Distinction/Merit/Pass or A/B/C of which grade A is the highest and grade C the lowest. Prior to 1997, results were recorded only as Pass (P) or Merit (M).

Certificate of Extended Education (CEE). 1975-1985: An examination aimed at sixth form pupils for whom GCE A Levels were considered inappropriate. As the examination never achieved official recognition, no CEE certificates were issued. Candidates received CSE certificates, along with a CEE "Letter of Credit". The letter of credit reported one of five "unofficial" CEE grades I-V of which I was the highest and grade V the lowest.

Key Skills. 2001-present: Non-age specific qualifications designed for use in schools, colleges, training, higher education and employment. Certificated from level 1 to 4, each level equates to those in the National Qualification Framework.

Certificate in Office Skills. 1984-2003: A range of examinations in Shorthand, Typewriting and Word Processing etc. The results are recorded as "Distinction", "Credit" or "Pass" and have no direct equivalence to other qualifications offered by WJEC or any other body.



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
